Using the PMESII-PT/ASCOPE frameworks, the operational environment in **Gaza** can be defined as follows:

PMESII-PT:

1. Political (P): **Gaza** is governed by **Hamas**, an **Islamist** political organization. <sup>1</sup> The political situation is characterized by ongoing conflicts and tensions with neighboring **Israel**, as well as internal divisions between **Hamas** and other Palestinian factions. <sup>2</sup>

2. Military (M): **Gaza** has a significant military presence primarily through the armed wing of **Hamas**, known as the **Izz ad-Din al-Qassam Brigades**. <sup>3</sup> They possess a range of weapons and have engaged in sporadic clashes with **Israeli** forces. <sup>4</sup>
